
#### **Uniform**

#### **Borough of Culture**

A three-day celebration is to mark the beginning of Waltham Forest becoming London's first Borough of Culture.

The Welcome to the Forest event will take place on Friday, Saturday and Sunday evening and will see giant light installations and a winter carnival.

The Borough of Culture programme was launched by Sadiq Khan "to put culture at the heart of local communities." The borough's council said it would be "the biggest party that Waltham Forest has ever seen."

Welcome to the Forest will be the biggest party Waltham Forest has ever seen and everyone is invited.

This year Waltham Forest is the first ever Mayor's London Borough of Culture. Our opening show *Welcome to the Forest* is created in response to the themes of our year celebrating Radicals, Makers and Fellowship. It's a unique event for all the family designed to celebrate our shared past, present and future in this much loved corner of north east London that we've chosen to call home.

Artists <u>Greenaway & Greenaway</u> will present *Into The Forest*, transforming Waltham Forest Town Hall with a high energy, audiovisual, site-specific film that tells the story of the borough through the eyes of Waltham Forest's diverse communities. Greenaway & Greenaway have collaborated with Mercury Music Prize-winning musician and producer <u>Talvin Singh</u> on the soundtrack. The Town Hall hosts a brand new commission from world-renowned, local electronic duo <u>Addictive TV</u> who present *Welcome To The Forest*, a unique piece of music created by sampling audio and video of Waltham Forest's rich and diverse musical talent.

Locally-based international festival curators <u>Continental Drifts</u> will transform Forest Road into a neon-lit, celebratory winter carnival featuring groups and individuals drawn from the borough and beyond in partnership with the legendary <u>Gods Own Junkyard</u>.

Lloyd Park will be home to *Nest*, a brand new commission from artists <u>Marshmallow Laser Feast</u>; an epic lighting installation choreographed to a transcendental soundscape created by composer <u>Erland Cooper</u> working with over 1,000 participants from local schools and choirs.
