Mission Grove Humanities Week 1st – 5th October 2018

We have lots of exciting visitors planned for our humanities week!

Monday 1 October

Year 3 Dr Rebekka Valcke (Archaeologist at Birkbeck College London), Being an archaeologist in Pompeii In this session, Rebekka will talk about some of the things she has found while digging in Pompeii, and how archaeologists try to reconstruct how people lived long ago.

Tuesday 2 October

Dr Rebecca Darley (Ancient historian at Birkbeck College London,), Ancient Coins

Rebecca will get the children to think about how coins changed over time, and what sorts of things historians can find out by looking at coins.

Wednesday 3 October

Thursday 4 October

Year 5 Rhodri Jones (Home Editor, Channel 4 News) What is 'the news' and how is it made?

We know that a lot of people, young people included, don't regularly watch the news. Rhodri will talk about his work of making 'the news', including how he and his team decide whether something is newsworthy, how they go about creating a news programme, and what happens once the programme has aired on TV.

Year 4

Dr Dan Stewart (Archaeologist at the University of Leicester) Going to School in Ancient Sparta

The Origins of the Minotaur

Dan will teach two sessions on Ancient Greece, touching on two of the most popular topics: childhood, and Greek mythology.

Friday 5 October

Year 1 and Reception Dr Jessica Reinisch (Historian at Birkbeck College London) What do historians think about 'time'?

In this session, Jessica will try out different ways of visualising the past: e.g. through hourglasses, timelines, tree rings, family trees. She will talk about how Mission Grove, Walthamstow, and London have changed over time.
