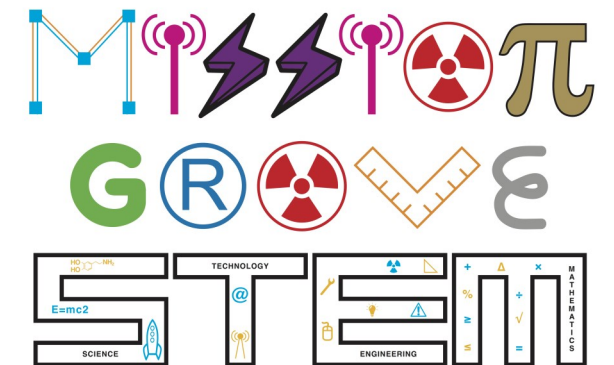
Parent Governor Applications
