Well done to Bullfinch for having 100% attendance this week!

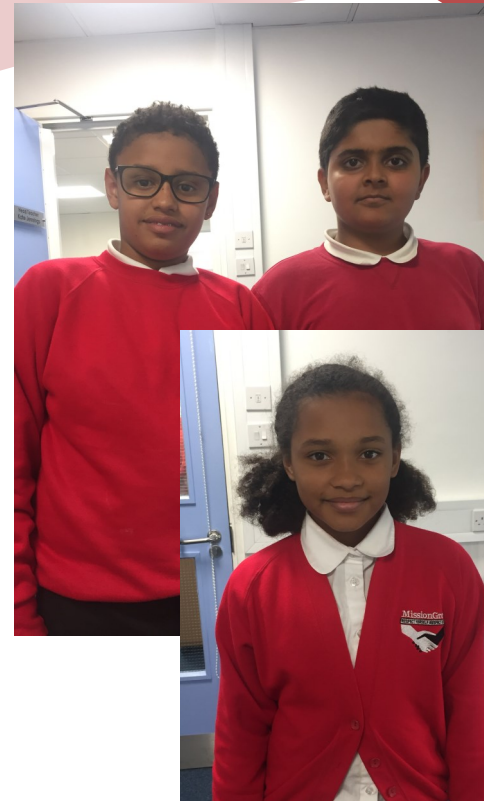
The English conversation classes will continue every Monday morning.
