Playground equipment up date

We have raised £1,574 from the Gofundmepage (still live), £82.26 from easyfundraising to date and £5,000 from the Christmas movie night and fair. This does not cover the £50,000 that we need to complete all of the works. We are going ahead with the works the week beginning the 24th February and will use some of the Capital funding we get from the Government and also look to the next financial years budget to help cover the costs. Nursery 2025

Children in nursery have been welcoming new friends and settling back in after the break.

Our topic is dinosaurs and we have started the term discussing what we already know about dinosaurs.

We will be learning facts about dinosaurs through stories and non-fiction texts. We will be broadening our vocabulary so we can talk about dinosaurs. Expect to hear children talking about "tails" "spines" "teeth" and "claws". We will be using some really unfamiliar words like "extinct" and "fossil"

Chinese New Year is coming up and we will be learning about the traditions of Chinese New Year around the world. We will be listening to the story of the animal's race. We will be cooking and trying Chinese cuisine.

Phase 1 phonics is continuing and we are building our rhyming skills through learning some new rhyming songs. We will be starting to find initial sounds in words and working out together, what objects have the same sound.

Children have been practising finding their name and writing some sounds from their name with adult modelling and support.

Reception 2025


Welcome back to a new year and a new topic! This term is an exciting and busy one for sure! We are learning about Journeys and Transport. We split the term up by themes, looking at Air Transport and Space, moving on to Land Transport and finally Water Transport. We have several story books linking to our topic which will engage and excite pupils imaginations. These stories will lead us well into Storytelling week, where we will put our ideas and creativity together to continue and change the endings of our stories. We also have 2 very exciting trips this half term, the Science Museum to kick off our topic with a bang and the Transport Museum to take us back in time to discover historical modes of Transport. We will have several visits to the Library coming up which Parents are encouraged to attend to promote early reading. In Maths, we will be working on comparing numbers up to 10, comparing length and size and recognizing simple patterns.

Year 2 are enjoying reading Lila and the Secret of Rain; this week they will be re- telling the story in their own words. In Maths they have been coming to grips with money! It would be great if you can support them at home with coin recognition and encourage them to make amounts with money. Looking ahead, the London Fire Brigade will be coming in to talk to the children about Fire Safety, Kingfisher have their Class Assembly, we have an Africa theme day planned and a trip to the British Museum! Please make sure you are signing your child's Reading Record at least once a week.

YEAR 3

We would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a HAPPY NEW YEAR and we hope that you all enjoyed the Christmas break! We would also like to thank you for the lovely Christmas party contributions we received – we were very touched by your kindness.

We are looking forward to the new term ahead and have many exciting activities planned. Below is just a glimpse of the different lessons we have planned for this term. The rest of the information can be found on the School website.

Literacy	In Literacy we will be looking at creating our own newspaper report based on our core text 'Krindlekrax' by Philip Radley.
Maths	In Maths, we will learn our times tables. The children should now start learning their times tables starting with 2s, 10s and 5s moving onto 3s, 4s and 8s. It is also important that children learn the associated division facts. Times Table Rock Stars is a great fun tool for this. We will also be learning how to solve multiplication problems and multiplying 2-digit numbers by 1 digit.
Science	Animals including humans - We will be learning about the human skeleton and what nutrients we should eat.
Geography	We will continue our journey through pre-history by learning what came after the Stone Age. We will compare the Bronze Age and the Iron Age and decide which age we would have preferred to live in.
Art & DT	We will look at the work of Paul Cezanne and create our own still life painting. We will also learn to make our own healthy wrap linking our learning to Science.

YEAR 4

The children have settled back into school wonderfully after the holidays and are already showing great enthusiasm for their learning. They are thoroughly enjoying our new topic on the Saxons and Vikings, diving into fascinating history and preparing for an exciting workshop coming soon! In Science, they are exploring the world of sound, while in PE, they're building their gymnastics, fitness and teamwork skills. To top it off, our guitar lessons are off to a fantastic start, with the children eager to develop their musical talents. We're looking forward to even more fun and discovery in the weeks ahead!

YEAR 5

Our first two weeks back in Year 5 after the Christmas break have been fantastic! The children have been busy with their swimming lessons, and the swimming teachers have been thoroughly impressed with their effort and progress.
